



- 9. Ventilation-Slots and openings in the cabinet and the back or bottom are provided for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation of the TV and to protect it from overheating, these openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the TV on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. This TV should never be placed near or over a radiator or heat register. This TV should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instructions have been adhered to.
- 10. Power Sources-This TV should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home consult your appliance dealer or local power company. For TVs intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.
- 11. Grounding or Polarization-This TV is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug(a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact you electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.
- 12. Power-Cord Protection-Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the appliance.
- 3. Outdoor Antenna grounding-If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the TV, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70-1984, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode. (Fig. A)



- 14. Lightning-For added protection for this TV receiver during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the TV due to lightning and power-line surges.
- 15. Power Lines-An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light of power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.
- Overloading-Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- 17. Object and Liquid Entry-Never push objects of any kind into this TV through opening as they may touch dangerous voltage points or shortout parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the TV.
- 18. Servicing-Do not attempt to service this TV yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.



SUPPLIED ACCESSORIES



LOCATION

For safe operation and satisfactory performance of your unit, keep the following in mind when selecting a place for its installation:

- Shield it from direct sunlight and keep it away from sources of intense heat.
- Avoid dusty or humid places.
 - Avoid places with insufficient ventilation for proper heat dissipation. Do not block the ventilation holes at the top and bottom of the unit. Do not place the unit on a carpet because this will block the ventilation holes.
- Install unit in a horizontal position.

Moisture condensation may occur inside the unit when it is removed from a cold place to a warm place, or after heating a cold room or under conditions of high humidity.


Therefore when the DEW letter light is on turn the POWER button off and allow at least 2 hours for the unit to dry out.

UHF/VHF ANTENNA HOOK UP

The UHF/VHF Rod Antenna(supplied) is detachable. Push the stem of the antenna into the hole which is located on the upper back cabinet of the unit.


Connect the Rod antenna to ANT.IN terminal of TV as shown in drawing.

For the best reception, extend the rod antenna and adjust its length and position. (Avoid handling the top section when making adjustments). In some areas it will be necessary to use an outdoor antenna. When an outdoor VHF antenna is used, disconnect the detachable Rod antenna.



When handling video tapes, take the following precautions


- Avoid moisture, which can condense on the tape if it is moved from a cold place to a warm one. Playing a tape that has moisture in it will damage the tape and your VCR. Before using a tape with these conditions, wait until the tape has warmed to room temperature and the moisture has evaporated.
- Avoid extreme heat, high humidity and magnetic fields.
- Do not tamper with the cassette mechanism.
- ◆ Do not touch the tape with your fingers.

ERASE PREVENTION


You may prevent accidental erasing of a tape by breaking off the tab on the back edge of the cassette. If you decide to record on the tape again, cover the hole with plastic tape.


AUTOMATIC TIMER RECORDING

Press TIMER SET button to set automatic timer recording. When the TIMER SET button is pressed, the VCR power and TV monitor will automatically go off and TIMER REC indicator lights. At this moment unit will automatically turn off.

TIMER RECORDING HINTS

- Make sure the channel you want to record is properly tuned in advance.
- The erase prevention tab on the cassette must be in place (or you must put tape over the hole).

- It is not necessary to press RECORD button for timer recording.
- Recording begins automatically at the set Start time
- When the TIMER SET button is on the VCR functions on the Unit cannot be operated at all. TV functions will work.
- If the DEW indicator comes on during timer recording, the unit will stop and will not resume recording, even when the moisture has evaporated.
- To stop timer recording, turn the TIMER SET button off.
- When the TIMER SET button is on, the auto-rewind feature will not work.







SETTING THE SLEEP TIMER






AUTO REPEAT PLAYBACK







AUTO REWIND-EJECT

When the end of a tape is reached during recording, playback, or fast-forward, the tape will automatically rewind to the beginning (or to the preset counter memory position). The cassette mechanism will disengage after rewinding and the tape will be ejected and the TVCR will shut itself off.

Notes:


- The tape will not auto-rewind during timer recording and One Touch Timer Recording.
- When tape is rewound to the preset memory position, tape will not be ejected and TVCR will not shut off.

CUE AND REVIEW (VISUAL SEARCH)

You may view the video program at a high speed in either a forward or reverse direction. When in the play mode, press F.FWD button to view the tape at a fast speed in the forward direction. To view the tape at a fast speed in the reverse direction, press REW button. The sound will be muted. This feature is used in finding a particular section of a tape.

Notes:

- When video searching a pre-recorded tape, it may cause noise bars (white lines) to move vertically. Also, the picture color fluctuates on and off. This is not an indication of trouble.
- You will get best results when playing back tapes that were recorded in the SLP mode.
- To return to normal playback, press PLAY button
- The picture will not be as good as normal during CUE and REVIEW.



SUPER HIGH SPEED SEARCH (LP/SLP MODE)

To Visual Search in super high speed press either fast forward or rewind button while the unit is in the play mode. Release button, then depress again and hold. The unit will now search in super high speed. For normal playback simply press PLAY. Note: Tape recorded in the LP mode will display a noise bar on the screen and the picture may revert to Black and White. This is normal.

STILL FRAME DURING PLAYBACK

If you press PAUSE button during playback with tapes recorded in SLP mode, the picture will "freeze" on the screen. You may use this feature to study details of a particular scene. Press PLAY button again to continue playback. If you use the

PAUSE button during playback with tapes recorded in the SP or LP mode, it may cause noise bars to appear more than with tapes recorded in the SLP mode. This is not an indication of trouble. **Note:** The TVCR will automatically switch to the Stop mode, if it is left in the PAUSE/STILL mode for more than five minutes.

NOISE CANCELLING


If you use the PAUSE button to freeze the picture during playback, usually there will be video "noise" lines on the screen. This is normal, however, this unit has a special feature that allows you to reposition or reduce the lines. Each time you press the PAUSE button the lines will change position on the screen.

This enables you to see the picture in its entirety without distracting noise lines.

TRACKING CONTROL

When noise bars appears during playback, adjust the channel UP/DOWN buttons on the TVCR, remote control to achieve the best picture, with channel "A" or "V" button.

Note: For tapes recorded on your TVCR, the center setting is usually best. Tapes recorded on other VCR's may required adjustment. If you encounter video "noise" during playback adjust to achieve the best picture.



DEGAUSS

Magnetism from nearby appliances might affect the color of the TV picture. If this happens, move the TV/VCR away from the appliance. If the color is still not correct, disconnect power cord from AC outlet then reconnect it after 30 minutes over.

CABINET CLEANING

 Wipe the front panel and other exterior surfaces of the unit with a soft cloth immersed in lukewarm water and wrung dry.

 Never use a solvent or alcohol. Do not spray insecticide liquid near the unit. Such chemicals may cause damage and discoloration to the exposed surfaces.

VCR HEAD CLEANING

 Picture playback may become blurred or interrupted while the TV program received is clear. This does not mean that the recorded program has been erased. Dirt accumulated on the head after long periods of use causes this problem. Head cleaning requires highly technical skill. Clean heads only when symptom occurs. Bring the unit to your nearest Service Center for a complete cleaning of the heads and cassette compartment.

SERVICING

 Should your unit become inoperative, do not try to correct the problem by yourself. There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Switch power off, unplug the power cord, and take the unit to your nearest Service Center for servicing.
