NOTE:

If the rotary tray No. 1 is not located in the first position, another number (2-5) will be displayed.



Press OPEN/CLOSE button on the CD player to open the disc tray. The disc tray slides out.

NOTE:

Both 3" (8cm) and 5" (12cm) compact discs can be played. Place only one disc at a time in each disc tray.

- To prevent the entry of dust and dirt, keep the disc tray closed when unit is not in use.
- Do not press down hard on the disc tray, since it may result in damage to or malfunction of the disc tray.

LOADING CDS WITHOUT STOPPING PLAYBACK

Your CD changer allows you to open the disc tray without stopping the playing disc.

Press OPEN/CLOSE on the CD player, and the tray opens without stopping playback.

Note:

 If you open the disc tray during playing a disc, but then press DISC SKIP to move to other disc compartment in front, the CD changer stops play and the disc tray rotates to start playing the next available disc.







Press the or button to select a track number. You can also select the track by using TRACK NUMBER buttons on the remote control unit. The display shows the selected track number.

Press STORE button. The first selection is now programmed in memory and second selection is ready to be programed.

Repeat steps 3, 4 and 5 for all the selections you want to program, up to the maximum of 32.

Press PLAY/PAUSE ► / II button. The selections programmed will play in the order you entered them.

NOTES:

- Press | ◀◀ or ▶► to move backward or forward through the programmed sequence while the sequence plays.
- When you want to program an entire disc as a selection, you must repeat Steps 4-5 for each track.
- You can use audible search while a programmed sequence plays.
- You cannot use DISC SKIP, the DISC NUMBER buttons, or the TRACK NUMBER buttons during programmed play.
- To finish the Program mode, press (STOP) then press PROG. button. The program is deactivated but remains stored until you turn off the CD player, or open the disc tray.
- To play a stored program again, press (STOP) and press PROG. button then, press ▶ (PLAY/PAUSE) button.
- To review the tracks stored in a program, press PROG. to activate the program, then press STORE repeatedly to advance through a display of the stored tracks.
- To clear the programmed sequence from memory, press POWER to turn off the CD changer or press OPEN/CLOSE to open and close the disc tray.

- Never wipe with a circular motion.

- Clean off dirt on the surfaces with a dry cloth.
- Never use thinner, benzene or alcohol since these will damage the surface finish.
